

Introduction

This quarterly *Crime in Utah* report is published by the Bureau of Criminal Identification to give governmental leaders and citizens a better understanding of criminal activity in the state. The report is a compilation of crime data reported by local law enforcement agencies throughout the state. The data is reported under the guidelines of the Uniform Crime Reporting (UCR) program, a national program which uses generic crime definitions to ensure that crime data is comparable across political boundaries. BCI forwards data collected from Utah law enforcement agencies to the FBI, who in turn combines it with data from other states to compile and publish an annual report called *Crime in the United States*.

UCR data is collected in two formats: "summary based reporting" which has undergone only minor changes since the 1930's, and "incident based reporting" (IBR) which uses computer technology to collect more detailed information. The summary based system is still used by about half of Utah law enforcement agencies. Therefore, the data from agencies participating in the IBR system is also presented in the summary format to ensure comparable numbers. It is also presented in more detail in a separate section of this report.

In the summary based system, crimes are divided into two categories: *Part I Crimes*, which include criminal homicide (murder, nonnegligent manslaughter, and manslaughter by negligence), forcible rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson; and *Part II Crimes*, which include all other non-traffic crimes. The Part I crimes, except manslaughter by negligence, make up the "crime index" used by the FBI to track our nation's crime situation. Therefore, these crimes are often referred to as *index crimes*. The number of known offenses and arrests are reported on Part I Crimes, while only arrests are reported on Part II Crimes. If multiple Part I offenses are committed in the same criminal episode, only the most serious offense is reported.


The Part I Crimes are also categorized as *violent crimes* (murder and nonnegligent manslaughter, forcible rape, robbery, and aggravated assault) and *property crimes* (burglary, larceny-theft, motor vehicle theft, and arson) for analysis purposes.


The statistics presented in this report are only as accurate as the data provided by the local law enforcement agencies. *Twenty-Four* law enforcement agencies did not submit data for this report.

Summary Analysis

- During the first three months of 2002 a total of 18,264 index crimes were reported. This **is a 1.25% decrease** over the same period in 2001, in which there were 18,495 index crimes reported.
- Violent crime **increased 4.41%**. Murder decreased 61.54%, robbery decreased 22.39%, while rape increased 31.82%, and aggravated assault increased 10.42%.
- Property crime decreased 1.58%. Burglary increased 5.85%, and arson increased 54.55%, while larceny decreased 1.62%, and auto theft decreased 13.41%.
- There were 23,295 arrests reported in the first three months of 2002. This is down 4.53% from the same time last year. Adult arrests **decreased 4.30%**, juvenile arrests **decreased by 5.14%**.
- The dollar value of property stolen during the first three months of 2002 was \$17,391,372, down by
 6.84% from last year. Reported recoveries totaled \$7,204,973, a 21.47% decrease.

Introduction - What is Incident Based Reporting?

The National Incident Based Reporting System (NIBRS) is an updated method of collecting crime data within the UCR program. It was designed to provide more comprehensive data for the management of crime in our society. In an incident based reporting (IBR) system, computer technology is used to collect more detailed information about the crimes that occur. The availability of detailed information about criminal activity, stored in a computer data base, makes the analysis of criminal activity a viable tool for law enforcement administrators and other public officials.

The Utah Incident Based Reporting System was implemented in 1991; 52 agencies submitted IBR data for this report. The data accepted by the Utah repository is also forwarded to the NIBRS repository where the FBI uses it to depict criminal activity nationwide.

The data from the IBR system is not directly comparable to the data from the summary based reports. Information about each incident and arrest is collected for 22 offense categories comprised of 46 Group A offenses. All offenses that occur in a criminal episode are reported, not just the most serious. Only arrest data is collected for 11 Group B crimes.

Converting to IBR takes a lot of planning, work, and patience. It also requires enough foresight to see the value of accurate, detailed crime data in understanding and managing this serious problem. BCI appreciates the following agencies which have made the commitment to participate in the NIBRS program:



CRIME AND THE OLYMPICS

Did the crime rates go up or down during the recent Olympic and Paralympic games? Or was there no change?

NIBRS data from four venue agencies was analyzed to see the results. The four agencies analyzed were Provo PD, Salt Lake City PD, University of Utah PD, and West Valley City PD. These agencies were chosen because they hosted Olympic events, and also submitted NIBRS data for February and March in 2001 and 2002.



A comparison of the data from the four agencies shows that crime rates were lower in 2002 for both February and March. (Data shown is for all criminal offenses)
