




REASONS FOR REVOCATION



*In February of 2000, BCI implemented a new program to ensure the integrity of the Utah Concealed Carry Permit by checking arrest records on a daily basis, this accounts for the dramatic 241.3% increase seen in 2000.

22.4% of total permits are located in counties off the Wasatch front


11.8% of total permits are held by non-residents

23 new concealed carry applications were denied during the 3RD quarter of 2001. The applicant has the right to appeal, and have the Concealed Permit Board review the reason denial was made. Each quarter approximately 20 revocation and denial appeals are reviewed by the Concealed Permit Board. The Board overturns approximately 1% after review.

A permit application may be denied for any of the following reasons:

- 1. Felony conviction
- 2. Convicted of an offense involving the use of Alcohol
- 3. Convicted of a Crime of Violence
- 4. Convicted of any offenses involving Controlled Substance
- 5. Convicted of an offense of Moral Turpitude (Fraud, Theft, Shoplifting, etc.)
- 6. Convicted of an offense involving Domestic Violence
- 7. Has been adjudicated as Mentally Incompetent
- 8. Is not qualified to purchase and possess a dangerous weapon or handgun pursuant to federal law
- 9. Cause to believe applicant may be a danger to self or others by evidence including but not restricted to:
 - A. Past pattern of behavior involving unlawful violence or threats of unlawful violence
 - B. Past participation in incidents involving unlawful violence or threats of unlawful violence C. Conviction of any offense in involving weapons violations
- When assessing good character the bureau may consider mitigating circumstances. Mitigating circumstances may include length of time since an offense, number of offenses, and type of offenses.
