

1,884 Regular Firearm Requests were pawn redemptions, of which 50 (2.65%) were denied. 35,011 Regular Firearm Requests were sales of new or used weapons, of which 441 (1.26%) were denied.

There were 35,092 requests for Concealed Firearm Permit Verifications for the 4th Qtr. of 2017 for the purchase or redemption of firearms.

409 new concealed carry applications or active concealed firearm permits were denied, revoked or suspended during the 4th quarter of 2017. The applicant has the right to appeal to the Concealed Firearm Review Board, which will review the reason for denial. Approximately 20 revocation, denial, and suspension appeals are reviewed by the Concealed Firearm Review Board each quarter; the Board overturns approximately 1% after review.

A permit application may be denied for any of the following reasons:

- 1. Felony conviction
- 2. Convicted of an offense involving the use of alcohol
- 3. Convicted of a crime of violence
- 4. Convicted of any offenses involving controlled substance

5. Convicted of an offense of moral turpitude (fraud, theft, tax evasion, issuing bad checks, robbery, bribery, perjury, extortion, arson, criminal mischief, falsifying

government records, forgery, receiving stolen property, burglary, vandalism, kidnapping) 6. Convicted of an offense involving domestic violence

7. Has been adjudicated as mentally incompetent

8. Is not qualified to purchase and possess a dangerous weapon or handgun pursuant to federal or Utah state law

9. Cause to believe applicant may be a danger to self or others by evidence including but not restricted to:

A. Past pattern of behavior involving unlawful violence or threats of unlawful violence

B. Past participation in incidents involving unlawful violence or threats of unlawful violence

C. Conviction of any offense in involving weapons violations

10. Submitting insufficient fingerprints for the Federal Bureau of Investigation to conduct a search of its files for criminal history information.

When assessing good character the bureau may consider mitigating circumstances. Mitigating circumstances may include length of time since an offense, number of offenses, and type of offenses.




